Safe School Ambassadors





Safe School Ambassadors Grades 4 - 12

The Safe School Ambassadors[®] (SSA) program is an evidencebased program. In 2010, results from the study showed that during the designated time period:

- SSA schools showed suspension rate decreases of 33%
- Non-SSA control schools showed suspension rate increases of $10\,\%$

When the Safe School Ambassadors program is implemented and delivered with fidelity, the following results are reported:

- Decreased incidents of bullying, harassment, cyber bullying, violence, exclusion and other forms of harmful behaviors and mistreatment
- Increased attendance and academic performance
- Reductions in the costs and losses in both time and money related to suspensions
- Improved relationships among and between students and adults
- Increased respect for diversity and different ways of thinking and acting
- Increased feelings of connectedness to school and each other

The SSA program is most effective when implemented over a 3-year time frame, which allows it to develop strong roots that anchor it firmly into school culture and practice. After the first three years of Community Matters providing the SSA Training, eligible schools are provided the opportunity to move into a Training of the Trainer (TOT) sustainability model. When schools move to the TOT, Community Matters partners with the school to support the program in a longterm sustainable way. With this approach, the SSA Program and the premises on which it stands become embedded into the school practices as a way of thinking, communicating and behaving.

Safe School Ambassadors

Virtual & In Person Training Options

Safe School Ambassadors (SSA) is a highly effective program that equips 4-12th grade socially influential students with skills they can use with their peers to prevent and stop bullying, violence, harassment and other forms of mistreatment. The Initial and Expansion Trainings are for new students and adults. Each option includes technical assistance and program implementation support, program guides, online tools, and resources for year-round implementation.

Community Matters trains up to 40 new 4th -12th grade students and 5-8 adults. (1:6 adult to student ratio for each day).

- In Person Training is delivered over 2 full and consecutive school days.
- For SSA Expansion Training (2nd and subsequent years): Schools may also opt to invite up to 12 previously-trained veteran Ambassadors on Day 2.

Safe School Ambassadors Refresher

This training is for experienced, previously trained student Ambassadors and program adults only. It is intended to re-invigorate the program, provide skills review, and assist with annual program planning. The Refresher includes training, program guides, online tools, resources, and coaching,

Virtual & In Person Training Options

For up to 50 veteran SSA students and a 1:6 adult to student ratio.

Safe School Ambassadors Training of Trainer (TOT)

This training model is designed for a team of people within a school, district or county office to be trained to conduct SSA Expansions & SSA Refreshers for schools that have been running the SSA Program with fidelity for at least 2 years and have an SSA Site License. PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Safe School Buddies Grades 1-3

The Safe School Buddies (SSB) Program is designed for students in first through third grades. The training provides the Buddies with examples of mistreatment and helps them understand what mistreatment looks and feels like. They learn and practice age-appropriate "Buddy Actions" they can use when they see different types of mistreatment such as teasing, put downs and exclusion. They also learn ageappropriate ways to effectively resolve conflict and problem solve. When the SSB Program is implemented and delivered with fidelity, the following results are expected:

- Increased awareness and understanding of what it means to be a good friend and positive influence in a peer group
- Decreased incidents of mean spirited and hurtful behaviors
- Increased ability to peaceably resolve conflicts and problem solve
- Increased respect for diversity and different ways of thinking and acting
- Positive feelings of connectedness to school and each other

The SSB Program is most effective when implemented over a 3-year timeframe, which allows it to develop strong roots that anchor it firmly into school culture and practices. After the first three years of a Community Matters trainer providing the 2-day SSB Training, the school can move into a Training of the Trainer (TOT) model whereby selected adults at the school are trained to provide the 2-day SSB training for the students and to keep facilitating the program. When schools move into the TOT model, Community Matters partners with the school to support the long-term sustainability of the program. With this approach, the core values and principles of the SSB Program become imbedded into the school practices as a way of thinking, communicating and behaving.

PROGRAM OPTIONS

Safe School Buddies In Person Training	The SSB Program empowers and equips socially influential students to promote kindness, respect for others, and to be positive role models with their peers. At its core, the SSB Program prepares younger students to become upstanders, to set positive and inclusive social norms on campus and to become Safe School Ambassadors when they enter 4th grade. 1st Year Implementation (Initial Training): Community Matters trains up to 30 new 1st -3rd grade students and 6-8 adults.
	2nd and subsequent years (Expansion Training): Community Matters trains up to 30 new 1st - 3rd grade students and 6-8 adults; on Day 2 schools may add up to 10 previously- trained experienced Buddies.
Safe School Buddies Refresher In Person Training	This training is for experienced, previously trained Safe School Buddies and adults. It is intended to re-invigorate the program, provide skills review, and assist with annual program planning. The Refresher includes training, digital program guides, tools, resources, and coaching. For up to 30 students and a 1:6 adult to student ratio.
Safe School Buddies Training of Trainer (TOT)	This training model is designed for a team of people within a school, district or county office to be trained to conduct SSB Expansions & SSB Refreshers for schools that have been running the SSB Program with fidelity for at least 2 years and have an SSB Site License. Contact Community Matters for eligibility requirements.

SUPPLEMENTAL SUPPORT

SSA or SSB Adult Leaders Workshop

Full and Half Day Virtual & In Person Training Options

This workshop is designed to empower Program Advisors and adult leaders involved in the SSA or SSB programs to achieve the highest level of outcomes from their investments. Participants are provided the opportunity to connect. network and collaborate with other local school leaders and Community Matters staff. Topics include; overcoming program obstacles, student engagement, family group meetings and activities, data collection support and best practices for operating with fidelity to achieve desired results.

For up to 40 adults.

SSA or SSB Practicum

For eligible TOT participants and licensed school sites Practicum Training includes the cost of the 2-day SSA Expansion training and coaching for two to three adult participants who have completed the TOT Training codelivering the SSA Expansion under the guidance of a Community Matters Senior Trainer. The CM Trainer provides pre and post training mentoring and feedback.

This online, self-paced training is designed to empower students to identify, prevent and get help for issues surrounding sexual abuse and molestation.

Online Training

The training empowers students to learn and set healthy boundaries and relationships. At the end of the training students will be equipped with tools to recognize, prevent and report when they see, hear, know and feel that their or their friends boundaries may be at risk.

Student Introduction to Tapping (EFT) for Self-Healing

2-Hour Virtual Training This workshop provides students with tools to help alleviate stress and anxiety through Tapping or EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique). Tapping is an easy to implement self-healing tool that uses a sequence of light physical "tapping" on external acupuncture points.

Two workshop session options available:

- One 2-hour workshop for up to 40 students and at least 1 adult (allows more time for practice)
- Two 1-hour workshops for up to 40 students/1 adult for each workshop.

Restorative Practices is a whole school approach that focuses on encouraging healthy relationships, restoring harm, and reducing discipline issues. Restorative Practices help staff members build stronger connections to students and each other, helps students create social norms based on empathy and understanding, and helps all stakeholders to build trust, repair harm and restore community.

The Restorative Practices training services listed below have been developed to support staff, administrators, and parents/caregivers in understanding and implementing Restorative Practices in their schools and communities.

Overview of Restorative Practices

Two 3-hour sessions -Virtual & In Person Training Options This training is designed as an overview for all school staff and administrators. It provides a foundation for individuals interested in using restorative practices with their students and staff - to deepen their understanding of its roots in restorative justice and effectiveness in achieving positive behavioral outcomes. The training explores key restorative concepts of affective statements, impromptu dialogue, and the use of circles, which are essential elements in the restorative practice continuum.

Participants will explore how to begin integrating theory into practice through:

- Utilizing affective statements
- Facilitating community building circles
- Responding restoratively to conflict and misbehavior

Times: Up to Two 3-hour sessions in a single school day with up to 35 participants in each session, for up to 70 total participants.

Restorative Practices for Administrators Training

Virtual & In Person Training Options This full-day training is intended for administrative-level staff with responsibility for school safety, climate, and discipline. It provides an overview of Restorative Practices and its relationship to discipline, school climate, and its roots in restorative justice. Participants will learn how to effectively establish school-wide restorative practices by building buy-in of staff, developing policies and procedures, training staff and leadership, and utilizing best practices and lessons from the field. For up to 35 adults.

Strengthening & Sustaining a Restorative School Culture

One Day Virtual & In Person Training Options For district administrators, teachers and all staff members who have been trained and involved in Restorative Practices for schools. Supporting and sustaining a restorative school culture requires ongoing efforts and teamwork. Keeping the momentum towards attaining a restorative school wide culture while not allowing obstacles to block the progress is key. This interactive training will explore ways to keep restorative efforts strong and sustainable while also expanding the impact. Guidance will be provided for school teams to identify connections between current initiatives and Restorative Practice plans. For up to 35 adults.





CIRCLES TRAINING FOR STAFF

Circles Training - Two Dav

In Person Training

This training is designed for all staff and administrators. It provides a foundation for individuals interested in using restorative practices with their students and deepening their understanding of its roots in restorative justice and effectiveness in achieving positive behavioral outcomes. The training is experiential and provides skills practice with affective statements, impromptu dialogue, and the use of circles, which are essential elements in the restorative practice continuum. For up to 35 adults.

Circles Training - One Day

Virtual & In Person Training Options This training is a compressed version of the 2-day training. It provides an overview for individuals interested in using restorative practices with their students and deepening their understanding of its roots in restorative justice and effectiveness in achieving positive behavioral outcomes. Experiential introductions to affective statements, impromptu dialogue and community building circles are presented. For up to 35 adults.

Connecting with Students Online Using Community Building Circles This series of 4 interactive modules will engage and motivate participants as they delve into the beneficial possibilities of using Circles with their students for in-person and online instruction. Community Building, Responsive, Curriculum and Restorative Circles will be explored as participants join in and design Circles they can immediately implement with their students.

Virtual Training Four Consecutive 1.5-hour modules (6 hours total) Over the course of the training, participants will leave with 4 customized circles ready for implementation with their students. Join us as we create and offer tips for designing, managing, and facilitating Community and Responsive Circles. For up to 35 adults.

Formal Restorative Conferencing

Two Day Virtual & In Person Training Options CM partners with the International Institute of Restorative Practices (IIRP) to provide this Formal Restorative Conferencing Training. This 2-day training is designed for individuals experienced in Restorative Practices who are interested in facilitating restorative conferences. Participants will:

- Learn how to plan and coordinate preconference activities, which are essential to the success of Restorative Conferences
- Gain skills needed for effectively facilitating conferences
- Understand how to develop and monitor high quality follow-up plans
- Recognize the benefits of Restorative Conferencing and its positive impacts on school discipline, suspensions and overall climate

For up to 20 adults.

* **Pre-requisite:** Participants must have prior experience with RP, either completing Community Matters' Restorative Practices Skills Development 2-day training or related experience.

School Climate & Safety Improvement

Full Day In Person Training These workshops are designed to help staff members understand the importance of school climate and its relationship to achievement and attendance. - Identifying the underlying and harmful forms of mistreatment on campus
- Building supportive and empowering relationships with students
- Techniques for empowering socially influential students to safely and effectively intervene when they witness mistreatment For up to 35 adults.

Educators Introduction to Tapping (EFT) for Self-Healing

2-Hour Virtual Training This workshop provides an understanding of the importance of school climate, its connection to educational outcomes, and what School Resource Officers and Campus Supervisors can do to strengthen school climate, including:

- Building supportive relationships with students
- Noticing the pervasive forms of bullying, cyber-bullying and other mistreatment
- Intervening effectively using relational power vs. positional power

For up to 30 adults.

This workshop provides educators with tools to help alleviate stress through Tapping or EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique). Tapping is an easy to implement self-healing tool that uses a sequence of light physical "tapping" or EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique) on external acupuncture points.

In this interactive workshop, participants will learn:

- how to use tapping as a technique to support personal well being and reduce anxiety.
- techniques to use with students in the classroom to ease stress for everyone.

Restorative Practices for Families

Two (1.5-Hour) Virtual Training Modules *in-person options available, This engaging two-hour workshop will equip parents/families with knowledge and skills to take action when they or their children witness or hear about bullying, harassment and cyberbullying. Participants will learn to use proven communication skills to encourage their children to talk with them more openly, respond effectively, and engage with school staff when incidents occur. They will also learn about the importance of bystander intervention in the bullying dynamic, as illustrated by the Safe School Ambassadors[®] Program, which equips student leaders with the skills to prevent, interrupt and stop acts of meanness. For one or more schools – up to 100 participants.

This training helps parents/families navigate current trends in social media, raise awareness of their child's online experience and model how to interact safely and responsibly in the digital world. Participants will also learn key signs of cyberbullying and mistreatment and discuss actions to take if their children are involved with bullying and mistreatment online. For up to 35 adults.

This two-part series is designed for parents, caregivers & school staff. Participants will gain skills, tools and strategies to collaborate with schools to bring restorative practices (RP) to life in order to create optimal learning environments. This series will also deepen staff skills in RP and provide opportunities to strengthen relationships and improve communication with families to support a positive school climate at home and at school.

Consulting Services

As a national thought leader with expertise and a proven track record in implementing and utilizing restorative approaches and practices for whole school climate improvement, Community Matters is available to provide consultation services to districts and individual schools that are interested in school climate transformation efforts.

Whole School Climate 360 Assessment WSC360 is a comprehensive school site or district-wide assessment and analysis process that identifies strengths, weaknesses, and gaps in climate improvement efforts.

A WSC360 Assessment can include but is not limited to: a comprehensive review of discipline policies and procedures; district-wide climate surveys; interviews with key educational leaders; a review of discipline numbers and patterns, focus groups with students, staff and parents; and a final report with best practice recommendations.

A two-day strategic planning session is provided that engages approximately 25 stakeholders from the school and community at large. This session provides an analysis of findings, training on how to use the Whole School Climate Framework as a roadmap for planning, and tools and resources for developing a school climate improvement plan.

Each WSC360 Assessment is customized and priced based on the size of the school or district, the scope of the assessment, and the specific circumstances of the school or district's climate.
