Restorative Practices: Leading the Change

The Need:

More and more schools are turning to Restorative Practices as a viable alternative to the zero-tolerance policies often associated with high suspension rates and challenged school climates. Many administrators are asking important questions about Restorative Practices:

- How do we imbed restorative practices in our existing systems and structures?
- How do we adapt and improve existing policies and procedures to support these practices?
- How do we gain the critically needed “buy-in” of staff, students and families?
- How do we ensure successful school-wide implementation?

The Workshop:

This one-day training is intended for administrative-level staff with responsibility for school safety, climate, and discipline. It provides an overview of restorative practices and its relationship to discipline, school climate, and its roots in restorative justice.

Participants will learn:

- The principles and key elements of Restorative Practices
- The benefits of Restorative Practices and its positive impact on school discipline, suspensions and overall climate
- How to operationalize and implement restorative practices in their district and school
- Strategies for overcoming the challenges to effective implementation
