How to Facilitate Restorative Conferences

The Need:

Restorative Conferences are an essential strategy in the continuum of Restorative Practices. Restorative Conferences bring together victims, offenders, and their support networks to address the impact of a wrongdoing, and determine how to repair the harms done. Schools that have embraced Restorative Practices are looking to gain the skills and resources needed to effectively facilitate a formal Restorative Conference, and are asking important questions:

- What is the structure and process for a Restorative Conference?
- How does it support disciplinary actions and accountability?
- Who participates in the conference and how are they identified?
- How do you manage the different needs and emotions of the participants?

The Training:

This 2-day experiential training will answer those questions and more. Through the use of engaging activities, participants will understand how to integrate theory into practice. Participants will:

- Learn how to plan and coordinate pre-conference activities, which are essential to the success of Restorative Conferences
- Gain skills needed for effectively facilitating conferences
- Understand how to develop and monitor high quality follow-up plans
- Recognize the benefits of Restorative Conferencing and their positive impacts on school discipline, suspensions and overall climate

Time and Cost:

2-days (8 hours per day); \$6,200 - \$6,500* (includes travel, trainer expense for most locations)
(maximum 30 participants)

Pre-requisite: Participants should have prior experience with Restorative Practices (RP), either completing our RP 2 Day training or related experience.
